History

1975 – Sarasota County Commission's resolution to have Representative Bafalis introduce legislation to add the Myakka to the National Wild and Scenic Rivers System 1978 – bill to study the Myakka River for inclusion in the National W&S System was introduced

1984 – final Myakka Wild and Scenic River Study was published

1985 – Florida Legislature designates Myakka as a state W&S river (258.501 F.S.)

1990 – Myakka Wild and Scenic River Management Plan was adopted

1991 – River Rule adopted (62D-15, F.A.C)

1998 – Memorandum of Agreement for administering the Myakka River Wild and Scenic River Protection Zone between Sarasota Co., DEP, and DCA signed

1998 – Sarasota County's Myakka River Protection Ordinance and Protection Plan adopted

2003 – Sarasota County's Tree Protection Ordinance and Land Development Regulations amended and adopted (Nov.); Earth Moving Ordinance and Zoning Ordinance (Dec.3, Public Hearing)

2007 – Memorandum of Agreement for administering the Myakka River Wild and Scenic River Protection Zone between the City of North Port, DEP, and DCA signed.

2008 – Sarasota County consolidated the Myakka River Protection Zone Ordinance

2008 – Myakka River Task Force is formed between DEP, FWC, state park police, Sarasota County Sheriffs Office, and municipal police departments from North Port and Venice.

2012 – Myakka Wild and Scenic River Management Plan was updated.
